Q6. Who will this initiative support and how many? (Beneficiaries)

This project will support BAME communities, LGBT communities, faith communities and disabled
people.
The training activity will have 90 beneficiaries.
The week of action will have 100 beneficiaries.
Q7. For what duration and how frequently will the initiative be operational?
Q1. For what duration and now frequently will the initiative be operational:
The project will run between April and November 2015 with training activity taking place on approximately a monthly basis. Training sessions will take place in different parts of the county (Kettering, Northampton and Wellingborough) and will be at different times of the day in order to make the training accessible.
The week of action will be taking place 10 th – 17 th October 2015.

Q8. Where will the initiative's beneficiaries reside?

Q9. What crime(s) do you foresee the initiative will help to prevent?
The initiative will increase awareness of Hate Crime and Hate incidents and the outcome will be increased levels of reporting with more individuals and organisations reporting. This will result in opportunities for earlier intervention which will prevent the escalation of hate incidents and crimes to
more serious incidents and crimes. As so many hate incidents are linked to Anti-Social behaviour, we
believe that this activity will have an impact on reducing incidents of Anti-Social behaviour.
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Q10. How will your initiative help to increase community safety?

The initiative will create more confidence in communities. There will be a greater awareness of the seriousness of hate incident and hate crime and the rigour in which sanctions can be applied. There will be a greater awareness of the ways and means to report hate crime and how reporting can help to resolve hate incidents and hate crime. In addition there will be the promotion of opportunities to report anonymously to support intelligence gathering.

At least 90 people will have their knowledge and confidence of hate incident and hate crime reporting increased. The events over the week of action will raise awareness of organisations across the county working together to stop hate in Northants. The week of action will partner with a number of statutory, community and voluntary organisations.

Q11. How many people will be involved in your initiative in delivering your initiative?

Q12. How will you actively involve beneficiaries in design, delivery and evaluation of your initiative?

We will bring together a steering group of representatives of BAME, LGBT, Faith communities and disabled peoples organisations. The steering group will help make decisions over the locations, timings and promotion of training sessions. The group will also design the week of action. This will involve design of the vigil events, and design and involvement in social media activity over the week of action and making decision about collaborative events with key partners. In this was the design of the week of action will involve a wide range of stakeholders and the activity with actively enage with a range of individuals and agencies across the county encouraging them to actively "Stop Hate in Northants" Evaluation of training will be done using post course evaluation forms. Evaluation of the week of action will be undertaken using evaluation forms at the events.

Q13. Will your initiative be inclusive of (and/or) collaborate with other faith groups and non-faith groups?

Our organisation has a commitment to working with others as a principle. The steering group for the project will have a broad range of representatives. We will be promoting our events through our well-developed networks with BAME communities, faith communities, LGBT communities and disabled peoples organisations. We are part of County Hate Crime reporting structures and wil be sharing information about our work on this project with the ASB/Hate Crime Strategic Group and the county Hate Incident Review Group.

Q14. Will your initiative add any social, economic and environmental value to your community?

Social

The project will provide additional social benefits by bringing together representatives of BAME, LGBT, Faith communities and disabled peoples communities providing an environment where other innovative and creative solutions for the county can be developed through creating opportunities for different groups to work together.

Economic

Reduction in Hate crime and resolving Hate issues at an early stage may very well influenceAnti-Social behaviour in the area which would have economic benefits for both local communities and local businesses. In addition the reduction of hate crime would reduce days lost to employers through stress and illness of employees, and potentially through the reduction of criminal damage, reduced insurance premiums.

Environmental

Creating an environment in which incidents are reported early and appropriate sanctions are put in place which will have the outcome of reducing Hate related graffiti and criminal damage. This will improve the local environment for all communities.

Q15. How will your initiative be sustained beyond the OFBCI funding award?

The training will raise understanding and awareness of a number of individuals who will be able to act as advocates in their communities on Hate crime and Hate incident reporting. This social capacity will exist long after the funding award has been spent. We will be approaching Kettering, Wellingborough and Northampton Borough Council to see if they will carry on the vigils over the subsequent National Hate Crime Awareness Week.

Q16. Will this project be part of a wider partnership? (*Please describe the nature/level of partnership and who are your partners?*)

We will seek to involve partners from the ASB/Hate Crime Strategic group. We will also engage partners from the Disability Anti-Hate Crime Group. We will seek involvement from the BME SRP and the Wellingborough Black Consortium in addition to the Northampton and Wellingborough Interfaith Fora. We will also seek to involve FAN and the Northampton LGBTQ forum who we have discuss the project with.

Q17. How will monitor and evaluate your performance and what evidence could you use to demonstrate that the project has been successful?

Training events will be monitored through the use of evaluation forms to establish that the quality of the training that we are delivering. We would also be evaluating week of action events using evaluation forms. We will be looking at the demographic profile of those attending training and events to establish if there may be groups of individuals with particular protected characteristics that may need more direct approaches to them involved.

In addition we will be looking at Hate Crime reporting rates to see if these increase following training or events in the week of action.

Q18. How could your local policing partners support you to ensure your initiative is a success?

We would be looking to the force to assist promote the week of action events. We would also look for the force to refer people who might benefit from Hate incident and Hate crime report training. Our organisation has well developed links with the force Hate Crime Co-ordinator who is also aware of our project.
